Having proved the Ameteur example is unusally a problem to decide what your to buy and where are a number of things to be taken into consideration before runking into a purchase that hay not come up to your expectations. The questions are.

- i. How much are you prepared to spend?
- 2. Do you want to get a small wit to get you through your year on SU or do you want to keep the gear and use it on fone later?
- 3. Do you want a transceiver or separate transmitter and receiver ?
- The answer to the first question usually has a bearing on the other two, .o once .you decide on the amount to be spent you are half way there.
- Almost any CV rig and a reasonably selective receiver will get you lots of contacts during the first fer months of operation as long as you have them connected up to a good antenna.

If you went a good rig that will be a long term investment it is wise to get one that covers all bands. You may feel that a single or triband rig is all you want right now but in a couple of yours when ten and fifteen are open you may wish that you could use thom.

If you buy used gonr it is best to listen on the even note to see what the point prices are and what he evenitable. Then if you buy from an amateur who has used the occupaent hethl be able to advise you on its operation and you won't be paying the 7% tex.

Separate TM and IX will cost more money and of course take up a let more space, then a transceiver would. For instance the Massu separate goar that his just come but costs around 1400 and that is in the States while the TW 101 costs 1700. It is essential to get a MANHAND only RM as a general coverage RM is not likely to have the selectivity or calibration that you will want. Other sets like the Drake RR 15, and MQ170 will perform fine but don't expect the same hind of performance that a new set will give.

Transmitters like the Ranger, DM40, and Valiant are fine CW rige but have no SSB capability so are not a good long term investment if you plan to go on fone. For mobile or portable operation a transceiver is a must be there is a point to heap in mind. If more Clarible operation is desired than that offered by current brancesivers you can go split frequency by adding the enternal VFO or an accessory and it will still be a few hundred Collins cheeper than separate FH and Ri, while giving the same flexibility.
