MINUTES OF DECEMBER 1984 MEETING

The Georgian Bay Amateur Radio Club met on Dec. 20th at the Tourist Information Centre, Springmount. The meeting was called to order by President Ian HXX at 8.15 P M.

There were 12 members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and ammended to read "orbited" instead of "cfcled". The minutes were moved adopted as ammended by the Secretary, seconded by Jim BFV and carried.

The Secretary-treasurer reported a bank balance of \$478.17 as of Nov. 22nd.

The Secretary read a letter from Dr. Toth stating that we could control the interference on our Repeater either by changing frequencies or each member installing a Continuous Tone Coded Squelch Signal. The CTCSS would cost about \$23.00 and outside users would not have access to the Repeater. It was agreed to persue the possibility of new frequencies. Jim CRV moved that the Secretary write to Dr. Toth again to ask if the pair, 146.13/146.73 are available or if another pair would be preferable. The motion was seconded by the Secretary and carried.

Jim BFV advised that he is in the process of recording the documentary "NASA at Work" showing the launch mission to the moon several years ago.

There was discussion on U.S. amateurs being able to operate as low as 3.750 MHz and that we should be sending in the recent questionnaire to CRRL.

The Secretary distributed the roster of Net Controllers for the next several weeks.

It was agreed that our Sunday Net should remain at 3.783 MHz but if there is QRM then the Controller should select the next closest opening going up to 3.790MHz.

The Owen Sound Amateur Class is now down to 7 or 8 students but they are progressing well.

The meeting adjourned on motion by Jim CRV.
