GUEST SPEAKER

Tom introduced Mr. Rick Hergott, Supervisor with the D.O.C. in Kitchener. Mr. Hergott distributed brochures describing amateur exams, regulations, T V I, restructuring of the amateur service and frequency charts.

He explained the four levels of the amateur licencing requirements and the related examinations. He provided answers to many questions from the members including locations and costs of exams, clarification of several regulations, maintaining logs, radio and telephone interference, tower and antenna installations, frequency allocations, operating in other countries, etc, until no further questions were forthcoming.
